

The North Carolina Senate's recent budget proposes a 100%cut in state appropriated funding for SHIIP (Senior Health Information Program) This would have a devastating impact on our ability to assist the state's 2.2 million Medicare beneficiaries. This potential cut comes at a time when the number of people eligible for Medicare is growing and the Medicare program is becoming increasingly complex.

- SHIIP is the only organization in the state that provides unbiased, accurate one-on-one counseling at NO cost to the consumer.
- In 2024 SHIIP helped NC Medicare beneficiaries save \$53 million: \$36 million through cost saving enrollments and federal financial assistance program application submissions, \$17 million through recovered benefits from complaints and medication assistance program assistance.
- SHIIP counseled more than 69.000 Medicare beneficiaries.
